***Adeline Family Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to full-time students who have declared an education major and are current or prior residents of Yakima Valley (Selah to Sunnyside).
- Deadline: February 1

***Albert E. Gerritz Memorial Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to full-time students who are majoring in education with preference given to those who demonstrate financial need.
- Deadline: February 1

***Alfred & Genevieve Gallucci Teacher Education Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to full-time students who have at least 30 graded credits completed at CWU, are of junior or senior standing, have declared Early Childhood Education or Elementary Education as their major, and have a minimum 3.25 cumulative GPA.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application, write a one-page essay explaining why you want to become a teacher, provide three letters of recommendation: two from CWU faculty in two different academic disciplines and one from a previous college advisor qualified to evaluate your character and potential for becoming an excellent teacher, and provide unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Amanda K. Hebler Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a CWU student who is of sophomore or junior standing, has declared a major in Education, has good academic standing, and has demonstrated financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Amy Marie Castner Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students and incoming transfer students admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term who have declared a major in Law & Justice and have minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA. Preference is given to students enrolled at the CWU-Lynwood Campus and/or students have demonstrated financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; write a four-page essay discussing your career goals and motivation; provide two letters of recommendation: one from a faculty member and one from a non-relative who can evaluate your character and potential to succeed in the Law & Justice field; and provide unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Anonymous Scholarship in Literature & Science***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current undergraduate CWU students who are pursuing a double major or major/minor combination in English Literature, any of the biological/physical science (Computer Science excluded) or Mathematics, are of at least sophomore standing, have a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA, and have demonstrated financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit two letters of recommendation from CWU faculty members.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Arne Randall Memorial Art Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students who have declared a major in Art Education.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit an essay describing your educational and career goals, any academic honors or awards you have received, any extracurricular activities you participate in, and why you deserve a scholarship for Art Education; and provide two letters of recommendation from CWU faculty.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Ben & Nancy Remak Scholarship***

- Amount: full in-state tuition for one full year
- Awarded to an in-state Law & Justice student enrolled full-time at CWU's main campus who has a 3.25 GPA or higher. Consideration given for students who demonstrate financial need (must complete a FAFSA by March 15).
- Application Process: Submit the online form.
- Deadline: March 15

### ***Berg-Albrecht Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to full-time undergraduate CWU students who are pursuing a degree in Secondary Education and are employed part-time on campus while receiving this scholarship.
- Application Process: Complete the online General Scholarship Application; submit a one-page essay expressing why you want to become a teacher; provide three letters of recommendation: two from CWU faculty in two different academic disciplines and one from a previous college advisor qualified to evaluate your character; and provide unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU. Applicants selected as finalists will be required to conduct a 15-minute teaching session with the Scholarship Selection Committee.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Beth Kohler Bardwell Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a female CWU student who is of junior or senior standing and has declared a major in Physical Education.
- Application Process: Complete the online General Scholarship Application; submit an essay explaining your career objectives, describing your physical education courses and how they have benefited your career goals, explaining your involvement in the field of physical education and why you should be chosen as the recipient for this scholarship.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Bill & Lora Stovall Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who is of junior or senior class standing and has a minimum 2.50 cumulative GPA. Preference will be given to a student with financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Boeing EET Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students and incoming transfer students admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for upcoming Fall Term who is fully enrolled and has declared an Electrical Engineering Technology major.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit a one-page essay describing you educational/career goals, your honors/awards, your involvement in civic or extracurricular activities, and reasons why you are the best candidate for the scholarship; provide three letters of recommendation from non-relatives who can speak to your character, academic ability, and potential for future success; provide a one-page resume and unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Boeing IET Minority Enhancement Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to full-time CWU students who have declared an Industrial/Technology Engineering major and are members of an underrepresented minority group.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Boeing Mechanical Engineering Technology Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students and incoming transfer students admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term who have declared a major in Mechanical Engineering Technology and are fully enrolled.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit a one-page essay describing you educational/career goals, your honors/awards, your involvement in civic or extracurricular activities, and reasons why you are the best candidate for the scholarship; provide three letters of recommendation from non-relatives who can speak to your character, academic ability, and potential for future success; provide a one-page resume and unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Bronwen Hatton Special Education Scholarship***

- Amount: \$1,000
- Awarded to a full-time undergraduate CWU student who has declared a Special Education major, completed at least 7 credits in Special Education coursework, has a minimum 3.00 GPA, and intends to teach in a central Washington regional public school. Preference will be given to students who have a family member with special needs and/or are a resident of a central Washington community.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit three letters of recommendation.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***C. H. & E. T. Moe Education Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who is of junior or senior standing, has a minimum 3.40 GPA, and demonstrates financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit three letters of recommendation: two letters must be from faculty in two different academic disciplines and one must be from a person outside the CWU community; and write a one-page essay expressing why you want to become a teacher. Applicants selected as finalists will be required to conduct a 15-minute teaching session with the Scholarship Selection Committee.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Carolyn Schactler Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a student who has a major in Fashion Merchandising or Theater Design with a specialization in costuming or a minor in Apparel Design, upper classmen standing, and a minimum 3.3 GPA.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit two letters of recommendation from professors on campus; write a two-page essay addressing your purpose in choosing your field of study, your career plans, and describing your relevant extracurricular activities; and provide a 11x17 colored concept or trend board of a fashion design you would like to complete.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***CDK Construction Safety Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who is majoring in Construction Management and minoring in Construction Safety or Safety & Health Management and has a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.80. Preference is given to students with construction experience or other outside activities.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit an essay addressing how you meet the criteria of the scholarship, why you are

majoring in Construction Management, and why you feel it's important to establish a culture within the construction industry that promotes safe work environment.

- Deadline: February 1

### ***Central Investment Fund***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to students who have admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> to enroll for the upcoming fall term, are a Washington state resident and entering as a freshman or transfer student, have completed a college-prep curriculum and maintained a GPA of 3.50 or higher among the required college prep courses, and have demonstrated leadership abilities and academic potential.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit a statement from your high school counselor certifying that you have completed a college prep curriculum. DO NOT SEND A TRANSCRIPT.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Charles & Georgianna LaRiviere Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time undergraduate student who has a minimum 3.0 GPA and is returning to CWU after withdrawing from CWU because of personal, financial, or academic reasons.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit a one-page essay expressing why you deserve a "second chance" at CWU.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Charles W. Wright Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a CWU sophomore, junior, or senior who has been admitted to the Teacher Preparation program, has a 3.40 cumulative GPA, and demonstrates potential for becoming an excellent teacher.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; write a one-page essay expressing why you want to become a teacher; provide three letters of recommendation: two from CWU faculty in two different academic disciplines and one from a previous college advisor qualified to evaluate your character and potential for becoming an excellent teacher; and submit unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU. Applicants selected as finalists will be required to conduct a 15-minute teaching session with the Scholarship Selection Committee.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Chester Z Keller Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who is a Philosophy or Religious Studies major, has a 3.30 cumulative and major GPA, and has made contributions to the department through non-course-related, discipline related activities.

- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and write one essay demonstrating your academic interest in Philosophy or Religious Studies, your contribution to the department through non-course-related, discipline related activities, and how Philosophy or Religious Studies will be incorporated into your future career.
- Deadline: February 1

#### ***Christine Rae Guadino Scholarship***

- Amount: \$500
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student of junior or senior standing who has a minimum 3.5 GPA and has demonstrated leadership abilities through extracurricular activities. Preference given to students who have worked with people with special needs or are majoring in Special Education with the intention to teach those people with special needs.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit a one-page essay describing your involvement in leadership through extracurricular activities and/or your involvement with people with special needs.
- Deadline: February 1

#### ***Clareta Olmstead Smith***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a junior or senior who is a History major, has shown outstanding academic ability, demonstrates financial need, has a minimum 3.00 GPA, and has completed a research project on a topic related to rural history.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit a list of history courses taken and grades for each course and a list of your honors and awards; write a letter to the History Department Chair that includes a statement of why you are studying history and how you meet the selection criteria; provide official transcripts from all college or universities you have attended besides CWU; and submit a list of three references in the History Department at CWU who are familiar with your work.
- Deadline: February 1

#### ***Construction Management Advisory Council Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who is a Construction Management pre-major and has a minimum 2.80 cumulative GPA. Preference is given to students who demonstrate financial need, have construction experience and other outside activities, and identify with one or more of the following minority populations: Women, Veterans, Non-Traditional-Aged Students, Native Americans, or a U.S. citizen whose origins are: Asian-Indian, Asian-Pacific, African-American, or Hispanic.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit an essay addressing how you meet the required and preferred criteria and why you are pursuing a career in Construction Management.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Cross Family Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a transfer student to CWU who has a GPA of 2.70 or less, has past involvement in varsity sports or other extracurricular activities, and demonstrates financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit a 2-page essay describing a humorous event or experience in which you have been involved.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Dale & Dorothy Jaques Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students and incoming transfer student admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term who are undergraduate class standing of sophomore or higher, or a graduate student. You must also be a Washington state resident, have a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA, and demonstrate financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Day Family Endowed Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current female CWU students and incoming female transfer students admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term who are first generation college student, have declared a major in Education, are of junior or senior standing, and having a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Deloris & Rolland Dewing Endowed Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a senior graduating from Cle Elum Roslyn High School and admitted to CWU by March 1<sup>st</sup> who has a minimum 3.00 GPA and demonstrates strong leadership qualities through participation in school programs or community service. Preference given to students who plan to major in Music and History.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***DeWayne Kendall Memorial Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to an incoming freshman student who has been admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term, is a graduate of Prairie High School in Brush Prairie, WA, and has outstanding academic performance.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Dohn Miller Special Education Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who has a minimum 3.00 GPA, has declared a major in Special Education, and has completed at least 7 credits in Special Education course work.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit three letters of recommendation from people who have firsthand knowledge of your academic excellence, service, involvement, and leadership activities; and provide a copy of your CWU unofficial transcript. Only one recommendation may be from a CWU Special Education professor.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Donald & Verna Duncan Community Service Scholarship***

- Awarded: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students who are of sophomore, junior or senior standing, are actively involved in the Donald & Verna Duncan Civic Engagement Center; and have a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and an essay describing your involvement with the Donald & Verna Duncan Civic Engagement Center.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Ed & Cristine Hansen Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a current CWU student or incoming freshman/transfer student who has been admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term, is fully enrolled, has a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA, and demonstrates financial need. Preference given to a foster child or incoming freshman.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit state agency documentation proving your status as a current or former foster child (if applicable).
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Education Department Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who is an education major admitted into the Teacher Preparation Program.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit three letters of recommendation: two letters must be from faculty in two different academic disciplines, and one must be from a person outside the CWU community, qualified to evaluate the your character and potential for becoming an excellent teacher; and write a one-page essay expressing why you want to become a teacher. Finalists for

the scholarship may be called upon to conduct a 15-minute teaching session with the scholarship selection committee

- Deadline: February 1

### ***Elliott Family Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who has declared a major in Science Education or related field and has a minimum 3.00 GPA.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit an essay describing the importance of developing contemporary skills in science teaching that is consistent with state and national science standards and your extracurricular activities, community service, or other outside work.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Ena Harris Berger Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to an incoming freshman or transfer student who has been admitted to CWU by February 1, is an unmarried female, has a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA, and demonstrates financial need. Preference is given to a Native American candidate.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Eugene Kosy Scholarship***

- Amount: \$1,000
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who has 12 or more credits and a minimum 3.00 cumulative and major GPA, is of junior or senior standing, and has completed at least one quarter at CWU prior to submitting an application.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; write a one-page statement of your career goals and objectives; provide two letters of recommendation—one academic and one personal; and submit your resume.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Ferne Daniel Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who has declared an Elementary or Early Childhood Education major.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; write a one-page essay expressing why you want to become a teacher; provide three letters of recommendation: two from CWU faculty in two different academic disciplines and one from a previous college advisor qualified to evaluate your character and potential for becoming an excellent teacher; and submit unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU. Applicants selected as finalists will be required to conduct a 15-minute teaching session with the Scholarship Selection Committee.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Fisher Companies Scholarship Fund***

- Amount: \$1,000
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who is majoring in Construction Management and has a minimum 3.00 GPA.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit a letter addressing how you meet the requirements and why you want to major in Construction Management; and provide two letters of recommendation, at least one of which is from someone in the construction or engineering industry.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Foundation Board Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students and incoming freshman/transfer student admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term who have past involvement in volunteer and service learning and a minimum 3.00 GPA.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit a 500-word essay describing your involvement or experience in volunteer and service learning.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Fred Meyer Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students and incoming transfer students admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term who are of sophomore, junior, or senior standing, have a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA, and have demonstrated leadership through community service, student clubs, organizations, or other activities.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; write a 500-word essay describing your leadership experience in community service, student clubs, organizations, or other activities, and how your experiences have developed your leadership skills; and provide two letters of recommendation from faculty, community leaders, and/or program advisors.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Gene & Charlotte Balint Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who has at least 20 graded credits completed at CWU, has been fully admitted to the CWU Teacher Preparation program at the time of application, and has a minimum 3.00 cumulative GPA.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; write a one-page essay expressing why you want to become a teacher; provide three letters of recommendation: two from CWU faculty in two different academic disciplines and one from a previous college advisor qualified to evaluate your character and potential for becoming an excellent teacher; and submit unofficial transcripts from any college or

university you attended before CWU. Applicants selected as finalists will be required to conduct a 15-minute teaching session with the Scholarship Selection Committee.

- Deadline: February 1

### ***George & Dorothy Mulinski Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who has a documented physical disability and demonstrates financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; write an essay stating your reasons for pursuing a college education and explain the impact of your disability on your educational process; provide three letters of recommendation; and submit documentation from a doctor verifying your disability.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Hal Wolf Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to an incoming freshman admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term who has a minimum 3.30 cumulative GPA and verified attendance at Business Week for any previous summer on any campus.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Harold & Martha Barto Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students and incoming transfer students admitted to CWU by February 1<sup>st</sup> for the upcoming Fall Term who have declared a History major, are of senior standing, and have an excellent academic record.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit a list of all the history courses you have taken and your grades for each course and a list of your honors and awards; write a statement concerning your financial need; submit unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU; and provide a list of three references in the History Department who are familiar with your academic abilities.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Heacock Family Scholarship for Women in Technology***

- Amount: \$1,000
- Awarded to a full-time female CWU student who is majoring in Mechanical Engineering Technology, Electronics Engineering Technology, or Industrial Education and demonstrates academic achievement of financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit an essay addressing why you are the best applicant for this scholarship.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Howard Family Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students and incoming transfer students admitted to CWU by February 1st for the upcoming Fall Term who are fully enrolled, have declared a Science Education major, have a minimum 3.50 cumulative GPA, and demonstrate financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; write a one-page essay expressing why you want to become a teacher; provide three letters of recommendation: two from CWU faculty in two different academic disciplines and one from a previous college advisor qualified to evaluate your character and potential for becoming an excellent teacher; and submit unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU. Applicants selected as finalists will be required to conduct a 15-minute teaching session with the Scholarship Selection Committee.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Hubbard Art Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a current CWU student who is of junior or senior standing, is seeking a BFA in Art, and demonstrates financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; submit a portfolio of 6 PDFs or high-quality photographs of your recent artwork; and write a one-page essay detailing why you deserve the scholarship.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Jeannette M. Hart Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a full-time CWU student who is in good academic standing, is of sophomore, junior, or senior standing, is a Washington state resident, and has past or current involvement in extracurricular activities, student organizations/clubs, or community/civic volunteering. First preference will be given to female students. Second preference will be given to students who demonstrate financial need.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application and submit three letters of recommendation from people who can attest to applicant's academic progress and his/her involvement in outside activities as listed above.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***Jere Cary Industrial Education Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to current CWU students and incoming transfer students admitted to CWU by February 1st for the upcoming Fall Term who have declared a major in Industrial Education and are fully enrolled.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application; write a one-page essay describing your educational/career goals, your honors/awards, your involvement in civic or extracurricular activities, and reasons why you are the best

candidate for the scholarship; provide three letters of recommendation from non-relatives who can speak to your character, academic ability, and potential for success; and submit a one-page resume and unofficial transcripts from any college or university you attended before CWU

- Deadline: February 1

#### ***Jerry & Gail Jones Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to a current CWU student who is of junior or senior standing and has a minimum 3.25 cumulative GPA. First preference will be given to Chemistry majors. Second preference will be given to Fine Arts majors.
- Application Process: Complete the online CWU General Scholarship Application.
- Deadline: February 1

#### ***John & Jan Ludtka Scholarship***

- Amount: \$1,000

- Application Process: Submit a letter of application explaining your achievements and why you wish to be considered for this scholarship; submit unofficial transcripts from high school and/or previous colleges; and provide three letters of recommendation written within the past year from individuals, other than relatives, who are familiar with your achievements. ### ***The Evergreen State College Roberto Clemente Memorial Scholarship***

- Amount: \$1,500
- Awarded to a new or currently enrolled student attending full-time who is pursuing a career in Puerto Rican or Central American studies. Applicants should have proficiency in conversational Spanish. You must demonstrate a commitment to public service, scholastic achievement, and financial need. - Awarded to new students of color (African American, Asian, Hispanic, Native American) entering the fall quarter as full-time undergraduate students. The scholarship will be given to students who have distinguished themselves in a wide range of areas, e.g., high academic achievement, community service, music, art, journalism, science, etc.
- Application Process: Submit a letter of application explaining your achievements and why you wish to be considered for this scholarship; submit unofficial transcripts from high school and/or previous colleges; and provide three letters of recommendation written within the past year from individuals, other than relatives, who are familiar with your achievements.
- Deadline: February 1

### ***The Heck Family Scholarship***

- Amount: \$1,000
- Awarded to a new freshman entering Evergreen Fall Quarter who is a high school senior attending a Thurston County high school. You must be the first in your family to attend college and have a demonstrated zero Expected Family Contribution based on a FAFSA determination. Preference will be given to students who can demonstrate the capacity to overcome hardship.

In addition, you must provide two letters of recommendation written with the past year and your FAFSA or Renewal Application.

### ***Jess & Hanna Spielholz Scholarship***

- Amount: \$1,000
- Awarded to a currently enrolled Evergreen student with an expressed desire to work in the field of health education. You must be at least a junior at the time of your application plus two terms of successful course work at Evergreen. Preference will be given to candidates who have successfully completed academic work in the health education or a closely related field and have demonstrated excellent communication skills.

### ***Jessica Kelso Memorial Scholarship***

- Amount: \$1,194

### ***JUNO Scholarship***

- Amount: \$6,334
- Awarded to a currently enrolled student attending full-time who shows great promise as an artist in drawing, painting and/or printmaking and who can demonstrate financial need.

***The McConkey Trustee's Scholarship***

- Amount: \$4,600; 2 awarded
- Awarded to new or currently enrolled students attending full-time who demonstrate professional promise, academic achievement, and financial need.
- Application Process: Submit a letter of application describing your academic achievements and outlining your future goals. This letter should also include a statement related to your financial need. In addition, your FAFSA or Renewal Application is required.

***Merit Award***

You must demonstrate financial need and academic potential.

You must also provide two letters of recommendation from individuals, other than relatives, who are familiar with your academic achievements. New students must submit unofficial transcripts from high school and/or previous colleges and current Evergreen students must submit copies of Evergreen evaluations or letters from program faculty specifically addressing academic achievement. Your FAFSA or Renewal Application is also required.
- Deadline: February 1

***National Science Foundation (NSF-STEM) Laboratory Based Biology and or Chemistry***

- Amount: multiple awards varying amounts up to \$10,000
- Awarded to new or currently enrolled students attending full-time who intend to obtain a Bachelor of Science degree with a concentration in laboratory-based biology and/or chemistry, and who intend to pursue a career in either or both of these fields. You must demonstrate financial need and academic potential.
- Application Process: Submit a letter of application highlighting your past academic achievements and extracurricular involvement, indicating how biology and/or chemistry relate to your long-term educational and career goals, and explaining how this scholarship will help you achieves your goals at Evergreen. You must also provide two letters of recommendation from recent College faculty or high school teachers. New students must submit unofficial transcripts from high school and/or previous colleges and current Evergreen students must submit copies of Evergreen evaluations or letters from program faculty specifically addressing academic achievement. Your FAFSA or Renewal Application is also required.

***Nonsequitur Scholarship***

- Amount: \$3,785
- Awarded to a currently enrolled student attending full-time.

Enrolled members of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs who are of Sahaptian descent are also eligible to apply with documentation verifying their Sahaptian ancestry. High school applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75, while transfer and current WSU student applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Graduate student applicants must have been accepted to graduate school. Please note that ONLY academics and activities engaged in while attending WSU will be considered. You must carry a full academic course load and hold a minimum GPA of 2.5.

***Study Abroad in Asia Scholarship***

- Awarded to WSU students who are participating in a study abroad experience in Asia. Applicants for the scholarship must be in good academic standing, of sophomore status or above at the time of study abroad, and have completed a minimum of 6 credit hours in Asia Program courses or their equivalent. Students may be studying in East Asia, South Asia, Southeast Asia, Central Asia or the Middle East. You must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 and have an education abroad program application in the “committed” status.

***Thompson Education Abroad Scholarship***

- Awarded to admitted students who are residents of Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, or Wyoming are eligible. WUE selection is based on information provided in the application for admission, including cumulative GPA, test scores and rigorous coursework. Priority is given to students with a 3.8 GPA or above. ### ***Western Washington University Presidential Scholarships***

- Amount: \$500-\$6,000
- Awarded to admitted students who demonstrate superior academic achievement. Selection for this award is based on your cumulative GPA, SAT or ACT scores, curricular rigor and achievements exhibited in the personal statement or other supporting materials. Recipients are identified through admission application materials. No separate application is necessary.

### ***Whatcom Educational Credit Union Scholarship***

- Amount: \$1,500
- Awarded to full-time students pursuing a degree, with the equivalent of junior or senior status. You must have financial need and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75. In addition, must be a member in good standing at Whatcom Education Credit Union.

***Willis Ball Memorial Scholarship***

- Amount: varies
- Awarded to an undergraduate student of color who is majoring in Physical Education, Health Education or Recreation. Demonstration of academic promise, community service, and financial need are considered when awarding the scholarship.

***Women of Western Scholarship***

- Awarded to full-time students who will have senior status in the following academic year. Selection is based primarily on academic achievement. Only students with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better are encouraged to apply. In addition, financial need, leadership qualities and activities are also considered. Special consideration may be given to students who are direct descendants of a member of Women of Western. Two letters of recommendation are required, at least one of which is from a WWU faculty member.

***Woodring Future Scholars Program***

- Awarded to students who demonstrate outstanding academic achievement in high school and a desire to pursue a degree in the Woodring College of Education. Recipients are identified through admission application materials. No separate application is necessary.

***WWU Retirement Association Scholarship***

- Awarded to students who are currently enrolled in an undergraduate program and attend at least half-time. You must have a cumulative GPA of 2.70 or higher at the time of application and have successfully completed a minimum of 90 credits.
