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PRE-EXISTING CONDITIONS UNDER THREAT: WASHINGTON

BACKGROUND: Earlier this year, the Trump Administration escalated their deliberate attempts to take away Americans' health care insurance protections. While the Administration had previously asked the Department of Justice to strike down the community-rating and guaranteed-issue provisions of the Affordable Care Act (ACA), in March they announced they are seeking to nullify the entire law.

The Affordable Care Act prevents insurance companies from denying coverage to people or charging them more because they have a pre-existing condition. These vital protections will be gutted if the Trump Administration has its way. About 130 million Americans under the age of 65 have a pre-existing condition.

Oral arguments are expected to start in the Fifth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals the week of July 9. Ultimately, the Supreme Court could decide the fate of the ACA as early as 2020.

The letter urged President Trump to make good on his campaign promise to stand with patients and stop his administration's attack on Americans with pre-existing conditions.
