Wapato Irrigation Project – Parton Drain Pumping Plant	Yakama Reservation	\$950,000 (plus \$1.04 million in non CDS funding for total of \$1.99 million)	The Wapato Irrigation Project (WIP) is a Tribal Irrigation Project that currently has over \$100 Million dollars in deferred maintenance. Due to ongoing lack of maintenance, the project suffers from irregular deliveries and sometimes system failures.
